

What is **Advance Care Planning?**

Advance Care Planning (ACP) is a process of understanding, reflecting on and discussing future medical decisions, including end-of-life wishes. While seven out of 10 deaths in the U.S. are caused by chronic illness, many people fail to prepare and ultimately do not have the end-of-life experience they would want for themselves. ProHealth Care has identified Advance Care Planning as a strategic initiative and is working toward providing comprehensive ACP education across the continuum of care — from the hospital to primary care and clinic settings to the community-at-large.

ProHealth Care

ProHealth Care is a regional specialty and primary care health network offering a full spectrum of integrated services to residents of southeastern Wisconsin. Focused on improving the health of the community, the ProHealth network includes two acute care hospitals, a rehabilitation hospital, the ProHealth Medical Group with 14 clinic locations, home care and hospice services and senior living communities.
