
- 710 Bed Facility / 117 ICU beds

- Inpatient Adult Palliative Team launched in 2014
- Outpatient services include: a palliative oncology clinic, a general palliative care clinic, and home based palliative care

Structure of Adult Inpatient Palliative Care Team

- 7 Physicians, 2 Nurse Practitioners
- 4 Social Workers
- · 3 Chaplains
- · 3 Nurse Coordinators
- 3 Administrative Professionals



The Nurse Coordinator Role


- Provide work-up and triage of new consults
 - Call the referring provider
 - Determine primary reason for consult
 - Basic chart review
 - Determine who patient's surrogate decision maker is, if necessary
 - · Triage urgency of palliative medical, psychosocial, and spiritual care needs
- Act as the first point-of-contact between the palliative care team and patient's family
 - Explain what palliative care is and the services that are offered
 - Help patients and their families become comfortable with receiving care from palliative team
 - Set up family meetings for palliative team
 - Provide phone-based palliative care for families this gives patients and their families a consistent advocate and resource to help them navigate the hospital/healthcare environment

Coordinators to gather

- Attend medical rounds to update referring providers and identify patients who would benefit from palliative consult. Also gives an opportunity to provide educations about palliative care and build relationships.
- Provide follow-up visits/phone calls with patients and families, freeing providers to focus on new consults as needed
 - Assess symptom management
 - Follow-up goals-of-care discussions
 - Patient and family support
- Keep the team organized by maintaining census and patient assignment spreadsheets
 - · Also help manage provider schedules by placing family meetings on their calendars
