




## Enhancing Early Palliative Care for CHF and COPD: A System-Wide Initiative

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## PROBLEM STATEMENT

- Patients with chronic conditions like CHF and COPD often involve complex symptom management and declining quality of life.
- Palliative care (PC) is frequently introduced too late leading to
  - unnecessary hospitalizations
  - suffering
  - care misaligned with patient preferences
- The project aims to
- Promote earlier involvement
- Clarify goals of care
- Manage symptom proactively
- Improve patient outcomes
- · Enhance quality of life
- Reduce unnecessary readmissions
- Lower healthcare costs

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND RESULTS






Figure 1. The total PC consult number for CHF and COPD patients

## **DISCUSSIONS AND INSIGHTS**

- To successfully adopt a culture of earlier consults, the first team we need to educate was ourselves with prior utilization focused on acute, crisis-based PC
  - Learning to tailor triage workflows
  - Aligning daily operations
  - · Improving efficiency
  - Establishing new goals for successful consult
- Ongoing education with feedback to referring providers increased appropriate early referrals
- Strong leadership support, understanding of integrated economic value in our Integrated Delivery Network (IDN) was needed to drive our project forward.
